At least eighteen (18) credits total must be at the 300-level or above. Course must be approved by the history advisor. From these 24 credits, at least nine (9) must be selected from courses that fulfill either of the following requirements. Three (3) credits must be completed in category **A** and three (3) credits must be completed in category **B**:

- A. primarily emphasize cultural/ethnic studies and social diversity within the United States (e.g. Latinos in the American West, African American History, US Women's History, etc.)
- B. primarily focus on non-European and world history (e.g. African, Asian, Middle Eastern, or Latin American history)
