

## Basic Computer Commands

### Windows Computer

<b>Command</b>	<b>Action</b>
<b>Ctrl + Y</b>	Redo an action.
<b>Ctrl + Right arrow</b>	Move the cursor to the beginning of the next word.
<b>Ctrl + Left arrow</b>	Move the cursor to the beginning of the previous word.
<b>Ctrl + Down arrow</b>	Move the cursor to the beginning of the next paragraph.
<b>Ctrl + Up arrow</b>	Move the cursor to the beginning of the previous paragraph.
<b>Windows logo key + Tab</b>	Open Task view.
<b>Windows logo key + Ctrl + D</b>	Add a virtual desktop.
<b>Windows logo key + Ctrl + Right/Left arrow</b>	Switch between virtual desktops that you have created on the right.
<b>Windows logo key + Ctrl + F4</b>	Close the virtual desktop you are using.
<b>Shift + click a taskbar button</b>	Open an app or quickly open another instance of an app.
<b>Ctrl + Shift + click a taskbar button</b>	Open an app as an administrator.
<b>Shift + right-click a taskbar button</b>	Show the window menu for the app.
<b>Shift + right-click a grouped taskbar button</b>	Show the window menu for the group.

**Ctrl + click a grouped taskbar button**

Cycle through the windows of the group.

## MAC Computer

<b>Command</b>	<b>Action</b>
<b>Command-C</b>	Copy the selected item to the Clipboard.
<b>Command-V</b>	Paste the contents of the Clipboard into the current document or app.
<b>Command-Z</b>	Undo the previous command.
<b>Command-Shift-Z</b>	To redo
<b>Command-A</b>	Select all items.
<b>Command-F</b>	Open a Find window, or find items in a document.
<b>Command-G</b>	Find the next occurrence of the item you are searching.
<b>Command-Shift-G</b>	To find the previous occurrence.
<b>Command-H</b>	Hide the windows of the front app.
<b>Command-Option-H</b>	To view the front app but hide all other apps.
<b>Command-M</b>	Minimize the front window to the Dock.
<b>Command-Option-M</b>	To minimize all windows of the front app.
<b>Command-N</b>	Open a new document or window.
<b>Command-O</b>	Open the selected item, or open a dialog to select a file to open.
<b>Command-P</b>	Print the current document.
<b>Command-S</b>	Save the current document.
<b>Command-W</b>	Close the front window.
<b>Command-Option-W</b>	To close all windows of the app.
<b>Command-Q</b>	Quit the current app.
<b>Command-Option-Esc</b>	Choose an app to Force Quit.

<b>Command-Tab</b>	Switch to the next most recently used app among your open apps.
<b>Command-Shift-5</b>	Open the Screenshot utility. You can also take screenshots using the following shortcuts:
<b>Command-Shift-3</b>	Take a screenshot of the entire screen.
<b>Command-Shift-4</b>	Take a screenshot of a selected area of the screen.
